

I-LL-RETURN-COME-WHAT-MAY

On one of the bleakest islands on earth, 22 men were left stranded for four months. They were part of Sir Ernest Shackleton's team of Antarctic explorers who, in 1914, set out from England in search of the South Pole.

Disaster struck when their wooden ship named the Endurance became trapped in the polar ice. The pressure of the ice gradually became so great that the ship splintered into matchwood and sank into the ice.

For six months the expedition took refuge on a large ice floe. They finally made it to Elephant Island - a desolate place with some of the worst weather on the globe.

Having no means of communication with the outside world, Shackleton took one of the six metre boats saved from the ship and with five chosen men set out on a 1300 kilometre voyage to get help. Shackleton promised the 22 men left behind on Elephant Island he would return for them — come what may!

The voyage to the whaling station on the island of South Georgia was horrendous. Mountainous seas of icy water churned them day after day, drenching everything and chilling the men to the bone.

After a few weeks they reached South Georgia Island, but to their horror, they discovered they

were on the wrong side. Huge mountains and glaciers separated them from the settlement.

The situation was hopeless. The men were frozen, exhausted and half-starved. Shackleton refused to give up. He knew the survival of 27 men depended on his leadership, courage and determination to keep his word.

Miraculously, they reached the settlement, and after a brief rest, Shackleton secured another ship and set off back to Elephant Island to rescue his men.

For months the ice and ferocious gales made the rescue impossible.

One day a narrow gap opened up in the ice leading to the island. In a lightning rescue, Shackleton charged through the gap, grabbed up the men and returned just before the ice crashed together again. The rescue was accomplished in 30 minutes.

Shackleton congratulated his men for being ready and able to be rescued in such a short time. With great affection and respect for the man they called The Boss, they replied, "Sir, you promised to come back for us and we never lost hope. Whenever the conditions improved we packed up our things saying, 'Maybe Shackleton will come today. We'd better be ready.'

Jesus Christ has promised to come back for his own. John 14:2-3

He warns us: "Therefore keep watch, because you do not know on what day your Lord will come." Matthew 24: 2
