



Read 1 Samuel 1:20-28 and 3:1-10

The Bible has two main parts: The Old Testament was written before Jesus came; and the New Testament was written after Jesus was here on earth. There are 39 different books in the Old Testament. Let's look at one named after a man called Samuel. In 1 Samuel we read about a lady, called Hannah. She was very sad because she didn't have any children. So she prayed to God and asked Him for a little boy. She promised God that if He gave her a little son she would give the boy back to serve Him.

So God gave Hannah and her husband Elkanah a lovely baby boy. They called him SAMUEL which means, "asked of God." Hannah kept her promise, too. When Samuel was about five, she took him to the temple. Samuel then lived at the.

temple and helped Eli the priest to serve God. Each year Hannah went to see Samuel and took him some new clothes. Samuel did his work well.

One night, when Samuel was about twelve, he heard a voice calling him. He thought it was Eli and ran in to see what he wanted. But it wasn't Eli. Eli told him to go back to bed. Then the voice called again, "SAMUEL!" Again he ran in to Eli. After this happened three times, Eli realised it must be God calling Samuel. He told Samuel to be ready to answer the next time God called.

Sure enough, God called again! Samuel answered, "Speak, for your servant is listening." God calls to us too, boys and girls. He asks us to listen to His teaching in the Bible. He wants us to love Him and do what He says. Let's be like Samuel, quick to obey God and our parents.






people a king. Then He told Samuel where to find the right young man. His name was Saul.
