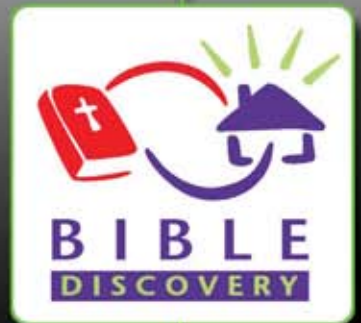

Last month we finished the story of Joseph. We learnt that even though his brothers had been cruel and mean to him, he loved them and forgave them. Finally, God used him to save his whole family and many other people from a terrible famine.

This month, we come to the most wonderful story of all! It tells us how God loved us and wanted to save us, not from famine, but from our sins. Nearly 2000 years ago, God sent Jesus to be born as a baby into this world. This was something wonderful only God could do. We call it a miracle. This is how it all happened...

A lovely young lady called Mary lived in the little town of Nazareth. She was engaged to be married to a man called Joseph. (This is a different Joseph from our lessons last month. That Joseph lived hundreds of years earlier). One day, the Angel Gabriel visited Mary. He told her she was going to have a special baby.

At first Mary felt afraid, but the Angel explained that her baby was the One God had promised. He was to be the Saviour of the world. Then Mary was really happy! The Angel also spoke to Joseph and told him the same thing. The baby inside Mary was God’s holy Son, and not Joseph’s son. The angel then said, “You are to give him the name Jesus, because He will save His people from their sins.”

When it was nearly time for the baby to be born, Joseph and Mary had to go to Bethlehem. Joseph walked and Mary rode a donkey. It took them quite a while to get there. The town was so crowded they could only find a stable to sleep in! There was no room anywhere else. That very night Jesus was born.

Imagine that! Jesus came from his beautiful home in heaven to be born in a stable. He did this because He loved us so much. I hope you have lots of room in your life for Him. Will you pray, “Oh, come into my heart Lord Jesus, save me from my sins, and make my heart anew!”?

Christmas is such an exciting, happy time with lots of fun, decorations, good things to eat, and presents! Of course, while these things are all good, we should always remember what Christmas is REALLY about. That's the BEST part! So what is it all about? Well, some angels from Heaven told us what this good news was!

One starry night, a long time ago, some shepherds were sitting in the fields near Bethlehem. They were looking after their sheep and talking together around their fire. Suddenly, they saw a very bright light, much brighter than the stars or the moon. They were scared stiff! Then from the light a shining angel spoke to them. “Don't be afraid!” he said. “I am here with good news for you, which will bring great joy to all people. This very day, the Saviour was born in the city of Bethlehem. He is Christ the Lord!”

For a long time the Jewish people had been waiting for the Saviour. So the shepherds could hardly believe what the angel said. “Is it really true, after all this

long time, that the Saviour has come?” they wondered. The angel said, “Go into

Bethlehem and there you will find the baby wrapped up in warm clothes, sleeping in a manger [this is a wooden box that holds straw].”

When he finished speaking, a great crowd of angels appeared in the sky and started to sing. It is hard to imagine how wonderful that must have been. Heavenly angels were singing in a glorious choir! “GLORY TO GOD IN THE HIGHEST HEAVEN, AND PEACE ON EARTH, GOOD WILL TOWARDS MEN.”

We may not be able to sing as well as those angels long ago. But we like to sing songs of praise and glory to God too at Christmas time! They are called Christmas carols. Many of these songs remind us of this wonderful time when Jesus came into the world as a tiny baby.

God sent Jesus to save us from our sins. That is the GOOD NEWS of Christmas—the best gift of all! The shepherds ran excitedly into Bethlehem to find the baby Jesus. The Wise Men wanted to worship Him, even though they knew He was far away. Quickly they packed food, water, and clothes for the long trip. They also packed some very special gifts to give to the newborn King. They mustn’t forget them!

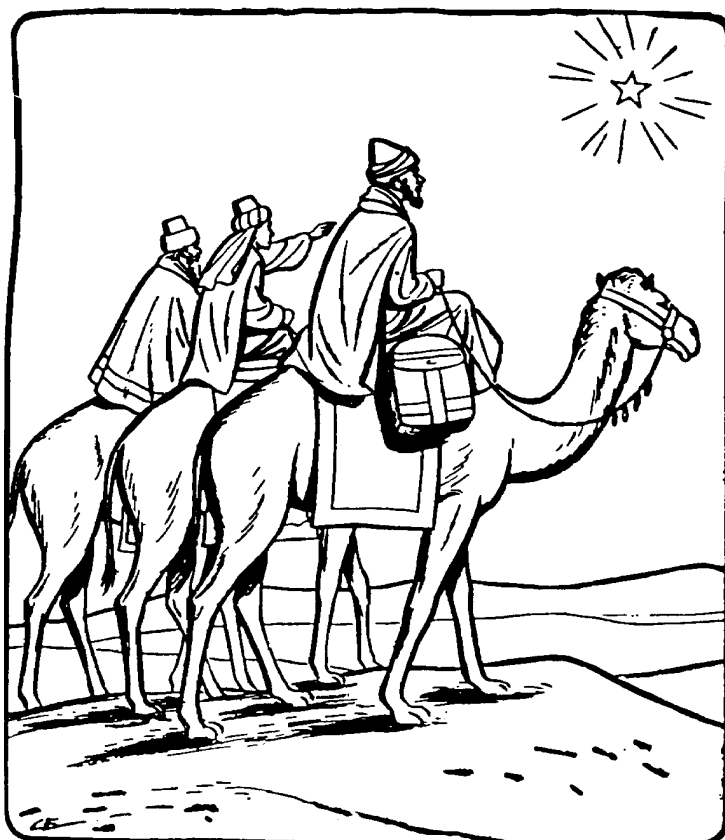

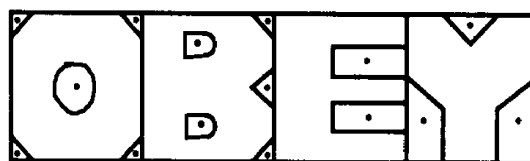

DAISIES

Have you ever walked through a paddock and noticed a wonderful patch of flowering daisies. Sometimes the ground seems to be carpeted with them, and they all open so beautifully. The daisy is one of those flowers which open their petals to the sun when it rises in the morning, and closes them at sunset. On a sunny day, you will find all the daisies open, but in the evening they will be closed again. In this way the appearance of the paddock changes completely from a beautiful daisy carpet in the morning to a green field in the evening.

A botanist proved that daisies will only open when the sunlight reaches them, though it used to be thought they would open when the right time came. One morning he got up early before the sunrise and went to the field where there was a fine crop of daisies. He put a bucket over a clump of them. At midday he again went to the field. Around the bucket the daisies were all open, but on lifting the bucket he found that everyone of those underneath had closed petals. No sunlight had got at them, so not one of them had opened. You see the daisy needs the sunlight.

When walking in long grass, you will notice that flowers growing there usually have long stems, so that the blossom is visible. If you find a dandelion or other flower growing in short grass it will not have so long a stem. The longer the grass, the longer the stem. That is a wonderful provision of Nature for God designed them that way. It enables the flower to push right up, so that the grass will not choke it or keep the sunlight from it, because the sunlight is necessary to its life.

Just as the sunlight is absolutely necessary to the daisy for it to open its petals, or to the dandelion if it is to blossom freely. We too need the sunshine of God's love if we are to live our lives to their full potential. Jesus Christ is the Light of the world and He is the one who brings God's love to us. God's Light and Love is necessary if our lives are to expand and grow and become beautiful. When God's love shines in our lives they will open, just like the daisy, and the lovely features of character that are Christ-like will show themselves in us. If we allow the clouds of sin and bad habits to come between us and that sunshine, then our hearts will remain closed, cold and unresponsive, and not at all beautiful.

Let us walk in the light of the Lord, Isaiah 2:5, and in that light we will find life.

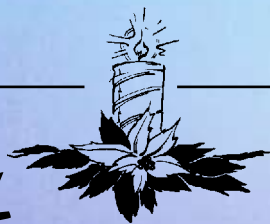
