Hi, my name is Rhoda and I'm a servant-girl for Mary and her family in Jerusalem.

Mary, her son John Mark, and I belong to a group called Christians, which means we're followers of Jesus. We believe He's God's son, the Messiah. John Mark's friend Peter was one of Jesus' disciples when He lived among us, so we know a lot about Jesus' teachings and how He was killed by the Romans and rose from the dead three days later.

Peter is now our leader and together, hundreds of us meet to learn more about Jesus, read the Scriptures and pray for each other. It's not easy though, especially since Herod and some Jews hate Christians and make it dangerous to be a follower of Jesus. Let me tell you about one incident...

The day started normal enough, but then Herod, the Roman ruler in Jerusalem, arrested Peter and put him in prison, guarded by sixteen soldiers. James, another disciple, had already been killed and we were afraid it would happen to Peter too.

We were sad and very scared, so we got together to pray at Mary's home. We prayed and prayed, asking God to protect Peter, and get him out of prison.

Suddenly I heard a loud banging on the outside door, so I went to see who was there. No-one else seemed to have heard it; they were praying so hard. It was scary because I thought it might be Roman soldiers coming to arrest someone else.

The knocking got louder, and I could hear a voice; "Let me in. Let me in."

"Who is it?" I asked fearfully.

"It's me, Peter! Please let me in, Rhoda."

"It can't be you sir," I said. "I thought you were in prison."

"It's me all right; an angel came and got me out."

I now recognized Peter's voice. Full of excitement I ran back to the others.

"Peter's here, he's at the door now," I cried.

Mary and John Mark looked at me as if I was mad.

"It must be his angel," they said.

All this time, Peter was still waiting outside, wondering why no-one had opened the door. In my excitement I'd forgotten to let him in!

At last John Mark went to investigate.

"It's me, Peter, why don't you let me in?"

"Stop, stop! I'll tell you all about it."

We sat quietly waiting for Peter to begin.

Knowing He was with me even in prison, gave me a great peace and I didn't feel afraid any more. So I lay down where I was, and soon fell asleep. Suddenly I was woken by a bright light and felt someone shaking my shoulder. It was an angel of the Lord, and he said," Quick, get up! Put on your cloak and sandals, and follow me."

Then the angel disappeared. God had sent his angel and rescued me. God really does hear and answer your prayers."

We were all amazed, and immediately praised God for His answer. What a surprising night!

Acts 2:42-47

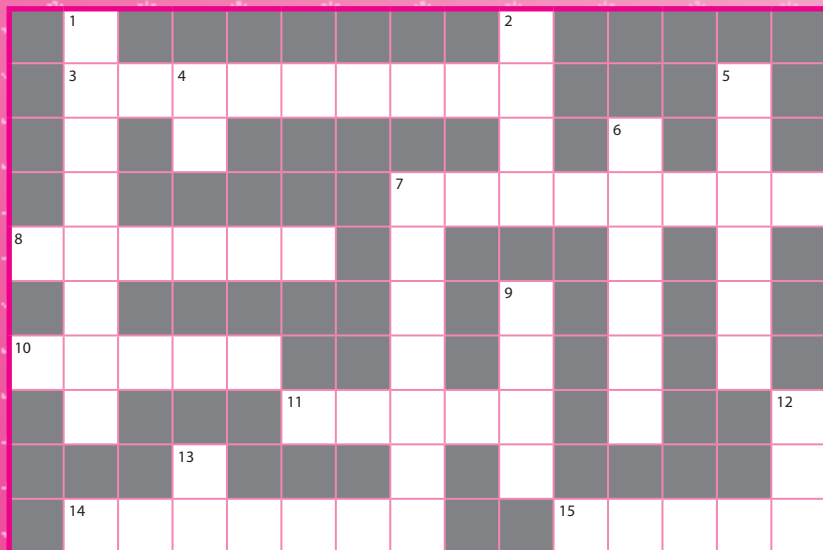
- 42 They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.

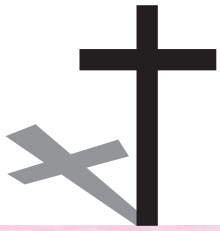

In the first five books of the Old Testament section of the Bible (called The Torah), you will be able to find what Jude and Ruth were taught at their school in the Synagogue. You will also be able to read in the Old Testament about the woman Ruth who was named after.
